# From Supreme



Brother Knights and Friends,

As you know, many areas in the southern United States, as well as the Caribbean, have been devastated by the back-to-back hurricanes, Harvey and Irma.

Since Hurricane Harvey struck the Texas Gulf Coast brother Knights, their families and others have contributed \$2.3 million for victims of the recent hurricanes and natural disasters. The Knights of Columbus also has taken a leadership role in assisting those affected by these storms, including the immediate distribution of more than \$720,000 for food, water and other necessities with more funds being distributed every day.

The outpouring of generosity to our appeal has been magnificent, and I personally thank each of you who have contributed. This level of service by our brother Knights is reflective of the work done last year by our Knights in Louisiana in response to the flooding there.

Charity has always been a defining characteristic of the Knights of Columbus. Pope Francis has said, "To Love God and neighbor is not something abstract, but profoundly concrete. It means seeing in every person the face of the Lord to be served, and serve him concretely." Our brother Knights continue to be examples of just such concrete service to their neighbors.

Many of these volunteer Knights are men whose own homes and property have been destroyed and yet are putting the needs of others in front of their own. These are the kind of men who show just how deeply our members believe in the Knights of Columbus' first principle of charity.

Charity is the Knights of Columbus' first principle and the basis for all we do as Knights. In other words, to be a Knight of Columbus is to be a man for others. And this is what our brother Knights in Texas, Florida and other locations have shown themselves to be.

Again, my thanks to all of you who have and are volunteering and to those of you who have contributed to our relief effort. Your efforts are making a difference.

# E-Membership

### Worthy Grand Knights and My Brothers All,

The new E-membership website is up and running, please take a minute to take a look.

### Knights.net

Let me take this opportunity to answer a few questions on the subject, starting with our vision statement. While our mission is to carry forward our founder's vision.

Our vision for the New Mexico Knights of Columbus is to create a Catholic, family, fraternal service organization consisting of; a council at every Parish, a Round Table at every Mission and a member in every Catholic family; who carry forward the teachings and values of our Church, while serving the needs of our members, and our communities.

## "Why recruit through e-membership?"

This new membership class offers possibilities for those men who are not yet ready to fully commit to council membership and the responsibilities required. This especially applies to those Catholic men who are currently working to build careers and families, both of which require major time commitments. It allows men the opportunity to participate in our service functions as desired, to strengthen their and their families faith and to financially protect their Catholic families.

It allows us the opportunity to act as mentors to these Catholic men and their families. Encouraging the strengthening of the domestic Church while providing benefits to our Church and our communities. It allows an opportunity for e-members to get to know us and the Order prior to making the full commitment of council membership.

## How do we apply e-membership into our recruitment efforts?

### Let me propose three ideas:

1) It is our duty as Knights to invite every eligible Catholic man and his family to join our Order but not every Brother is comfortable recruiting. To some approaching an unknown person and asking him to join can be nerve wrecking.

So let me propose e-membership recruiting in its simplest form. This week take a couple KofC prayer cards and write the website (**Knights.net**) on the front. When you attend mass this week simply hand the prayer card(s) to your fellow parishioner and his family. Commenting something like "You should be a Knight. Check out our website when you have a minute." In this case the website is going to do the sales work for you.

2) How many times have we received a completed prospect card or form 100 from an enthusiastic candidate and in the time it take us to organize an admission committee meeting and the first degree he loses interest. In today's fast paced world, immediate action has become the norm.

So let's not make him wait, simply use e-membership as the first step in the process. Pull out your smart phone and sign him up at **knights.net** right there. As he is doing so you can explain the first degree process and the importance council membership plays in his Parish and community.

3) We are constantly discussing the importance of the Prospect List. E-members are men, know to us, who have a vested interest in our Order. They receive regular emails from Supreme, they receive regular visits from field agents, and they should receive regular invitations for your council to participate in council activities. While some may not become council members immediately they will become council members eventually.

### How does e-membership count towards our council membership goals?

E-membership does not currently count towards the state or local council goals. However as I mentioned above if we employ the right strategies they will eventually become council members. Councils will receive credit when e-members transfer into local councils.

### What is e-membership in comparison to council membership?

E-members are place into what's call a State Division, a holding place overseen by the State Council. They pay dues (\$30) directly to the Supreme Council, the State Council in turn bills Supreme for State Per-Capita payments.

E-members are encouraged to participate in local council's meetings, service projects and social meetings. As they have not received their first degree, they are unable to vote or hold council positions (officers or directors). Also discretion must be exercised when discussing degrees at meetings.

E-members are issued traveling cards. These cards are easily distinguishable from the regular council membership cards.

### What is required to convert an e-member to a council member?

As mentioned above E-members have not received their first degree. Admittance should be handled similar to that of a new candidate. The admission committee should interview the e-member and present his application to the council for approval. Following council approval he must attend a first degree to become an official council member.

His form 100 should be emailed to membership@kofc.org asap following the degree, noting a transfer from the State Division to the local council. Membership credit is given to the state and local council at this point. As with any transfer, Supreme Council will credit the local council for dues paid by the member.

This new class of membership will no doubtably change the way we operate. As with any new process there

This new class of membership will no doubtably change the way we operate. As with any new process there will be changes and adaptations made along the way but this initiative has the possibility to expedite our Orders growth exponentially here in NM. (Remember there are 198,000 Catholic men in our jurisdiction who are not yet Knights.) It is up to us as fraternal leaders to adapt this growth into strong councils that are the go to ministry of our Parishes and our communities.

Thank you for taking the time to read my emails, I hope you find them informative and inspiring. My door is always open please let me know how I can help.

# From Master of the Fourth Degree, Rich Favela

The Patriotic Exemplification scheduled for Columbus Day, Monday, October 9, 2017 has been cancelled. However, I am still going to hold an Exemplification this calendar year and have selected Saturday, November 4, 2017 in Albuquerque as than alternative to Gallup. Specific location and hosting assembly is still being determined.

The Patriotic Degree's transition to the new Fourth Degree uniform is in full swing. Production is lagging and with a backlog of over 2,000 orders, Supreme is modifying the ordering process to speed up delivery. And because the demand is so great for the uniform, the Supreme Knight has extended the 25% discount from September 30th to October 31st!

Color patches denoting Fourth Degree officer positions (SM, VSM, MFD, DM, FN, CCC) will be worn behind the emblem on the beret. Past Faithful Navigators are authorized to permanently wear the white patch behind the beret emblem. Patches cannot be ordered with the basic uniform; currently, the acquisition process for those eligible to wear colored patches is to email the Supreme Master (suprememaster@kofc.org) requesting your colored patch and providing a mailing address for the patch to be sent to. Do not call the Supreme Master's office to request your patch.

The official dress for a current Sir Knight or new SK candidate is now a black, navy blue or dark gray suit worn with a plain white shirt, long necktie (color not specified), black shoes and sox and a Fourth Degree lapel pin (presented to the SK candidate at his Exemplification). The pin is the Catalog # PG113 pin; the Fourth Degree lapel pin with American flag will not be authorized for wear with the Fourth Degree uniform, even if the uniform is worn with the sword, service baldric and gloves as a color corps member. It can still be worn with the Full Regalia kit until June 30, 2018. The social baldric is not authorized for wear with the Fourth Degree uniform and after June 30, 2018, it cannot be worn with the Regalia tuxedo.

Star Assembly Award for FY 2016/2017 At the provincial meeting in Salt Lake City last month, winners of the Star Assembly award were announced for each District. Our Lady of Incarnation Assembly #3309 in Rio Rancho and St. Michael the Archangel Assembly #3330 in Las Cruces are the winners for the District of New Mexico. Congratulations! The plaques/certificates will be mailed directly to me and I hope to be able to present them at the state Mid-Year Meeting in Deming the weekend of December 9/10.




# Did You Know?



### KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS EMBLEM

The emblem of the Order dates from the second Supreme Council meeting May 12, 1883, when it was designed by James T. Mullen, who was then Supreme Knight. A quick glance at the emblem indicates a shield mounted upon the Formée Cross. The shield is that associated with a medieval Knight. The Formée Cross is the representation of a traditionally artistic design of the Cross of Christ through which all graces of redemption were procured for mankind. This then represents the Catholic spirit of the Order. Mounted on the shield are three objects: a fasces standing vertically, and, crossed behind it, an anchor and a dagger or short sword. The fasces from Roman days is symbolic of authority which must exist in any tightly-bonded and efficiently operating organization. The anchor is the mariner's symbol for Columbus, patron of the Order, while the short sword or dagger was the weapon of the Knight when engaged upon an errand of mercy. Thus, the shield expresses Catholic Knighthood in organized merciful action, and with the letters, K. of C., it proclaims this specific form of activity. The red, white and blue in the background of the shield and the foreground of the Cross of Malta are the colors of our country. As such, red is the symbol of stout-hearted courage, of pulsing activity and a full measure of devotion. Blue is the symbol of hope, of calm tranquility under God and of confidence in the protection of our country. White is the symbol of nobility of purpose, of purity of aim and of crucible — tried ideals to be carried out. But there is another symbolism of color in red, white and blue. This is the ecclesiastical symbolism in which red becomes the reflection of the drips of Christ's redemptive bloodshed upon Calvary, and of the martyr's bloodshed in defense of the faith. Red then is the symbol of Faith, of belief in Christ, in the Redemption and in the knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. White is the color of the Eucharistic Host, pledge of God's Eucharistic presence among men, of the infinite love God has for man and the overwhelming affection which the God-man has for each individual. White then is the symbol of Christlike Charity. Blue is the color of Our Lady's mantle, in which she wrapped her beloved Son, through Whom came salvation to a sinful world. Blue is then the symbol of Hope.

The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose has been a Knights of Columbus tradition for 57 years. In 1960, groups of Columbian Squires in Mexico, Canada and the United States decided to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe by carrying a rose across North America from Canada to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. In 2001 Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson, at the 119th Supreme Council Meeting in Toronto, addressed the effort in culture of life terms, referring to the Our Lady of Guadalupe – One Life, One Rose Program. He urged that it be expanded to every North American jurisdiction.

In recent years the program has expanded from three to six silver roses traveling the western, central, and eastern corridors of North America, with Knights of Columbus from Canada to Mexico carrying the roses from destination to destination, and finally to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico.

Every stop along the route of the Silver Rose Pilgrimage is an occasion for prayer and spiritual renewal centered on the rosary. English, French and Spanish booklets containing recommended prayers, scripture readings and a litany

2017 marks the 57th year of the program, which began in 1960. New Mexico will receive the Silver Rose on October 8, 2017 from the state of Arizona through Gallup, and then transfer the Silver Rose to the state of Texas thorough Anthony on November 5, 2017.

It will be the responsibilities of the receiving District Deputy to pick the Silver Rose up from the preceding District. The transfer should be coordinated for the end of the day of the last day that your district is scheduled for the Silver Rose. Districts 18 and 20 will need to coordinate with Arizona and Texas, respectively.


