

#### 5 REASONS WHY YOU SHOULD PRAY THE ROSARY

October has many traditions. There's post-season baseball, tailgating at football games, apple picking and, of course, Halloween. But most importantly, there is the Rosary.

As **decreed** by Pope Leo XIII, October is the Month of the Rosary. For Knights of Columbus, this has a special significance. When a man joins our Order, he receives a Knights of Columbus rosary – at 1.9 million members, that's a lot of rosaries. And praying the rosary is an activity that our members do communally as part of council life.

According to Catholic traditions, St. Dominic was given the rosary by the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1214 in the Monastery of Prouille.

Since then, it has become one of the Catholic Church's powerful tools of prayer. But why pray the Rosary? Here are 5 of them. One for every decade.

#### 1) The Blessed Mother gave us 15 Promises if we prayed the rosary

Alanus de Rupe, a 15<sup>th</sup> century Dominican preacher, claimed that he was visited by the Blessed Virgin Mary, who gave <u>15 promises</u> to Christians who prayed the rosary, including the Blessed Mother's special protection and greatest graces, the light of God, a powerful armor against Hell, as well as dominance over misfortune.

#### 2) To obtain world peace

"Continue praying the rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary, in order to obtain peace for the world and the end of the war, because only She can help you." This is what <u>Our Lady of Fatima said</u> to three children, Lucia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto in June 1917.

The Blessed Mother visited the children in Fatima, Portugal from May 13, 1917 to October 13, 1917 a period that culminated in the Miracle of the Sun, otherwise known as, "The Day the Sun Danced."

#### 3) Time to reflect on the Gospel mysteries

The rosary consists of the Apostle's Creed, the Hail Mary, the Our Father, the Glory Be, along with other prayers. However, in between each decade, we are invited to reflect on the **Mysteries of the Gospel**: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, and Luminous.

In these mysteries, we rediscover, examine, and ponder the stories from the Gospel, and discover the real meaning of those events in the silence of our hearts.

#### 4) Spiritual healing

And speaking of silence, another purpose of praying the rosary is to allow the repetition of the prayers enter into the silence of our hearts, where Christ's spirit dwells.

It is in that silence, we become more connected with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Not only that, but Jesus <u>reveals to us</u> that "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind."

But to do so, we must make time for Him. The rosary is the perfect way to make time to connect with God, and for spiritual healing. Take 15 minutes a day to be one with Him.

#### 5) Prayer works!

The power of prayer is unspeakable. The answer to every prayer is a miracle, in and of itself. It is our lifeline to Him, to our souls, and to each other.

But the reason why October is the Month of the Holy Rosary is due to the power of prayer.

In 1571, Pope St. Pius V organized a group of Christian forces, known as the Holy League, in defense of an imminent invasion by the Ottoman Empire. Before a battle with the Ottoman fleet in the Gulf of Patras, in the Ionian Sea, the pope called on all of Europe to pray the rosary for victory. These prayers was answered, with the Holy League defeating the much larger Ottoman forces on October 7 at the battle of Lepanto.

To commemorate the victory, Pius V established the feast day of "Our Lady of Victory" – also known as Our Lady of the Rosary.

Hundreds of years after the battle of Lepanto, Pope Francis is now <u>calling</u> all Catholics this month to pray the rosary daily to "protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other."

So, in solidarity, let us pray to our most gracious advocate, the Blessed Mother, for peace throughout the world, and within our souls. It only takes 15 minutes.










## From Worthy Lecturer SK Jimm White

October 2022



Mark Twain once said: "Travel is fatal to prejudice, bigotry, and narrow-mindedness, and many of our people need it sorely on these accounts. Broad, wholesome, charitable views of men and things cannot be acquired by vegetating in one little corner of the earth all one's lifetime."

We were in Vancouver, British Columbia last month, there for 8 days. A very different experience, mostly good, some not so much. One day we went to an area of Vancouver called Gastown. An older part of town, kind of touristy, but that's ok. We walked a lot that day but I needed to rest for a few, so I sat on a bench while the others walked and visited more of the shops. It gave me a chance to just sit, watch, and listen. I must have heard 50 different languages in those few minutes I sat on that bench. And while I enjoyed the "international" flavor of this experience, I was also very aware of the underlying presence of LGBTQ+ and individual moralities in most aspects of that city, including the "in-your-face" advertising on local television.



Last weekend we were in Alamogordo for an amateur radio gathering. Pam and I thoroughly enjoyed the fellowship of friends we have known for years, all of them we have been talking to for those many years, but some we finally got to meet face to face for the first time.

It also gave us the time to get to now the city again, I hadn't been there since I was an officer in Las Cruces. Our sense of Alamogordo was decidedly far more Christian, more conservate. People openly talking about Jesus and God, with a sense of reverence that was refreshing. Among our group there were Christians of may denominations, including Roman Catholic, and even Anglican Priests. At a group dinner at a local restaurant the night before I looked around the room and saw families praying before dinner, OUT IN THE OPEN EVEN!!! Our whole group at dinner that night prayed before our meal, and the wait staff were respectful of that.



In some respects' I think Samuel Clemens was correct in as much as travel gives us a broader view of the world beyond our own little corner of the earth. But sometimes that view can be disappointing. Living in my own corner of the earth here, I have heard how expansive the LGBTQ+ is, but to actually experience it on such a broad scale was disheartening. Now I know how far it has gone, and how far we have to go in our push back. It seems, if you let yourself think this way, that there is no coming back from this, that it has gone too far to come back, that this is the new normal.

In Psalm 42 we hear: My tears have been my food day and night, while men say to me all day long, "Where is your God?

Lord, make me an instrument of Your Peace: Where there is hatred, let me sow love: Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith: Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; And where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master,
Grant that I may not so much seek To be consoled as to console;
To be understood, as to understand;
To be loved, as to love;

For it is in giving that we receive, It is in pardoning that we are pardoned,

And it is in dying that we are born to Eternal Life. Amen There was bright spot in Van Couver, (besides the great food and some of the most beautiful scenery I've ever seen), we went to Saturday Mass in a small neighborhood mostly Asian parish with a Vietnamese Priest. The people at that Mass were quiet and respectful, the teenagers there were the lectures and altar boys/girls, and I felt a sense of reverence. Father Leo asked me later if I could understand the priest, I said "surprisingly, sometimes ...".

Last weekend we went to Saturday Mass at St. Jude's in Alamogordo, another neighborhood parish. The priest was Nigerian and the Deacon was also a ham radio operator, who had been at the ham fest earlier that day. Of course, we visited about that. It was immediately apparent that the Knights council for that parish handled most, if not all, the functions around the Mass. They were greeters, lectures, EM's, and sacristans. I had a chance to visit with some of them after Mass, and for a long while talked with the Priest and Deacon who seemed very interested in us, and who wanted to spend some time to know us. It was a good day.

So, I think Twain was right about the need to travel. Had we not traveled we wouldn't have understood how far we have to go to get our world back, but we also would not have experienced that we are not alone, that there are others in this fight with us. This is where God is, this is where hope is, in the hearts and souls of the faithful living in today's Sodom and Gomorrah's, in the smaller communities and towns, in the small neighborhood parishes and churches that have always been the heartland, the foundation for faith and hope.

I think, no I KNOW, prayer is all important. Vatican II charged the Church to be a missionary Church, to evangelize Jesus to the world. Prayer is the first, most important step to that goal.


When I pray the Liturgy of The Hours, I often dedicate that day to the hope that we can all come back to God and Jesus. In the quiet of my prayer, I start to feel hope and an understanding that God is always with us, that we, all of us, are not alone, and He will not abandon us.

Remember the promise of Jesus: "And the gates of hell shall not prevail against it". So let me conclude with this from Mahatma Ghandi:

"Prayer is not asking. It is a longing of the soul. It is daily admission of one's weakness. It is better in prayer to have a heart without words than words without a heart."
















# **Never Forget**
