SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

“Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples ...” (Gospel for Dec. 31, Lk 2:29-31)

From Worthy Lecturer SK Jimm White



In the years we've been married, my wife Pam has diagnosed me, quite correctly I suspect, as ADD, and she says I've probably been that way all my life. Again, I suspect she's right. It is not uncommon for me to have five or six projects of my own going on around the house at the same time, along with what ever Pam has asked me to do, along with what ever projects I've got going for the hospital in Santa Fe.

I'll start mowing the lawn, get about half way through, now I think of something else, go to my reloading bench, size some rifle brass, and I think of something else, go get on the radio and listen to some morse code, thinking of something else, log into the hospital and check on one of my projects, think of something else. Now I'm in the back yard, oh look, there's the lawn mower in the middle of the lawn, I'll finish that later. Now I forgot where I was going.

And don't even get Pam started about my channel hopping – makes her crazy To say I'm easily distracted would be the understatement of the century. But I will tell you this, I am quite certain the devil understands my condition as well. In this journey of mine back into the Church, I often find it very difficult to remain focused on Mass or on my Liturgy of the Hours. It is not uncommon for me to stop in the middle of a prayer and re-focus, or to go back and re-pray the last prayer because I realized I don't remember what it just said, I wasn't paying attention. The same happens in Mass, I suddenly realize I'm not there and I have to refocus. I know Satan is using my ADD against me, to move me away from God, Jesus and the Church.

How do I combat that?

Well, it seems Archbishop Saint Charles Borromeo, (1538 – 1584), may have an answer. As I was praying the Office of Reading on the Saturday of his feast day, I came across this:

In his sermon to the last synod he attended, St. Charles speaks of a priest who complains that as soon as he comes into church to pray the Office or to celebrate the Mass a thousand thoughts fill his mind and distract him from God. Good to know I'm apparently not alone in this.

St. Charles asks: but what was he doing in the sacristy before he came out for the Office or Mass? How did he prepare? What means did he use to collect his thoughts and remain collected?

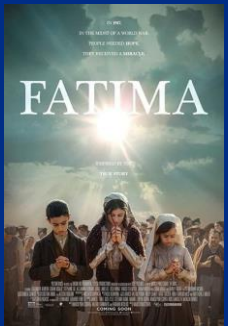
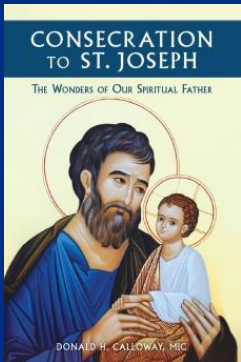
As he goes on, he offers the priest a solution – meditate on Jesus. He tells the priest to quiet his mind, to meditate before Mass, to think of what he is doing when he offers Communion, and to meditate after Mass.

How do I quiet my mind? I look on the cross and think of the sacrifice Jesus made. I imagine myself standing at the foot of the Cross that day, looking up at Jesus. Now I'm in place in my mind where Satan won't go, and I'm safe. When I come out, I'm quiet and I can continue my prayers or participate in the Mass.

It's different for everyone, but if you're ADD like me - and most of you will have to admit you are - find that quiet place, find what works to clear your mind, someplace Satan won't go because God and Jesus and the Holy Spirit are there with you.

Then, come back out ready to join the fight alongside Jesus against Satan.

By the way, I lost count of the number of times this month I got up from this reflection to go do something else before I finally got it finished this afternoon!

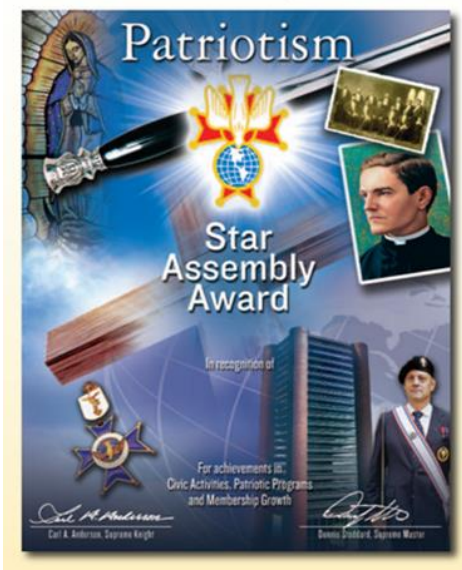


The Star Council Award recognizes outstanding achievement in membership, insurance and programming.

WANT TO VOLUNTEER?

Social Media Communications (part-time) includes managing and promoting social media accounts in cooperation with our marketing strategy goals.

Pro-Life Outreach Coordinator(s) will assist the President and Development Director with organizing, promoting, and recruiting participants for pro-life events like 40 Days for Life and the Jericho Walk.

Receptionist(s)- Part time will welcome clients as they come to the pregnancy medical clinic, make sure forms are completed, entered, and filed, schedule appointments, and do basic office work. Client Advocacy training will be required and provided by PDL.

Spanish-Speaking Client Advocates (Part-time) will assist clients who are Spanish-speaking in our services, from pregnancy testing, options consultation, to case management. At this time, we are not seeing a high-volume of Spanish-speaking clients and so this will be an on-call position for a designated day and time-frame. We are looking for 10 volunteers to commit to 9-12:30 or 12:30-4 on any given day, Monday through Friday. Client Advocacy training will be required and provided by PDL.

Weekend Cleaners will do basic upkeep of building such clean bathrooms, sweep and mop floors, and vacuum.

Office Assistance (part-time) will fulfill basic office duties, filing, organizing, product ordering, printing, and mailing.

Event Planning will assist President and Community Outreach director in various tasks for our annual Gala, Galentine's, and other related events.

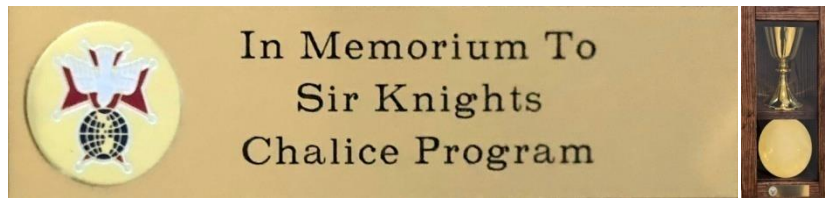
